## CHALET 1850 ELEGANCE & AUTHENTICITY

Atelier Giffon is an interior design firm specializing in the design of exceptional living spaces.

These family cottages reflect the quest for authenticity towards which Atelier Giffon strives every day. This soul that they convey through all their projects, this search for authenticity, which is characterized by the nobility of the materials, the balance of the proportions, the concern of the detail, the quality of the finishes, the choice of the local craftsmen, with whom they work since now 10 years.

To take full advantage of the panoramic dimension of the site, with a view of the Bellecôte and Grand Bec peaks, Atelier Giffon did not hesitate to modify the roof, which was raised to 6.15 meters.

The opportunity to create a jacobin with a daylight multiplied by a window of 4.25 m wide by 2.9 m high! This generously proportioned glass flight invites the landscape into the heart of the chalet, especially in the living room, which is literally connected to the snow-covered or green landscape. While the natural light spontaneously sculpts the veining and knots of the omnipresent sunburned wood.

A true technical feat that allows owners to enjoy the show as it should be, without having to lean out the window to appreciate the mountain tops!

## LES BRUXELLOIS A REAL GEM IN COURCHEVEL

Set against a steep hillside in the resort of Courchevel 1850, this chalet anchors its foundations in the mountain, while taking advantage of its panoramic setting.

Its architectural configuration bears witness to this, with its four levels below the first floor and its elevation in a forward position. The conceptual challenge for Atelier Giffon was to domesticate the six levels, which oscillate between light and dark areas, and the contrasting surface areas of 50m<sup>2</sup> on the ground floor, 141m<sup>2</sup> on the second floor and up to 330m<sup>2</sup> on the first floor.

Each floor is dedicated to specific uses, naturally leveling the functions. The optimization of the technical parts has allowed the main rooms to evolve with generosity, such as the wellness and leisure area, the day areas and the master suite.
